## **Hand, Foot & Miscellaneous Tools – Safety Tips**

Prior to use, always inspect hand tools for defects or damage e.g., splintered, loose, bent, or cracked tool handles, mushroomed tool heads, sprung tool joints, worn tool teeth).

☐ If a tool fails your inspection, remove it from use.
$\square$ Wear personal protective equipment (PPE) appropriate for the task and weather conditions, including items such as a hat with brim, long-sleeved shirt, long trousers, gloves, sunglasses, closed-toed shoes, and sunscreen.
$\hfill\Box$ Use eye protection when the tool produces flying, crumbling, chipping, sparking, or splintering debris.
$\hfill\square$ Consume an adequate amount of water for the weather conditions.
$\hfill\square$ When working in warm weather, take frequent breaks in the shade.
$\hfill\square$ When cutting, always cut away from the body.
$\hfill\Box$ Always use the proper tool for the job.
$\hfill\Box$ Follow all product label instructions, including those for PPE use, when using a hand applicator to apply pesticides or fertilizers.
$\hfill\square$ Rotate tasks frequently to reduce the potential for repetitive motion injuries.
$\hfill \square$ Stand with your back straight when using long-handled tools such as hoes, rakes, and shovels.
$\Box$ Protect your back when picking up heavy items by maintaining a straight back bending your knees, firmly grasping the object, and slowly lifting with your legs.
$\hfill\square$ Avoid using tools above your shoulder height.
$\hfill\square$ Use an insect repellant when biting or stinging insects are present in the task environment
$\hfill\Box$ Do not horseplay with tools.
$\Box$ Digging with your bare hands can result injuries such as cuts, punctures, or insect bites. Accordingly, dig with proper tool and gloves instead of using your bare hands.

## Using a bow saw

- 1. Make sure that the wood is held firmly if you must use your hand for this, keep it well away from the blade.
- 2. Start slowly, pulling the blade backward towards you until the blade is well into the wood. Then push and pull in a steady rhythm using the whole length of the blade.
- 3. Always mask the saw after use either use a plastic 'clip-on' mask or tie a length of sacking around the blade.
