- Only EA bailiff and police have powers to demand licences.
- Extensive powers of entry, search, seizure and arrest.
- Have to work to same standard of proof as police 'beyond reasonable doubt'
- Sec 32 of Salmon Act (suspicious circumstances) now includes all species. Person has to explain how they came into possession of fish etc.

The intelligence led approach:-

- EA is not a blue light service and cannot respond immediately to every incident reported
- In common with other law enforcement agencies we have adopted the National Intel Model and target their resources
- EA have a national and Area based intel gathering, analysis and dissemination capability Intel shared with partner agencies
